PRESIDENTS REPORT

Looking back at 1991 we can be justified in feeling great pride in our various accomplishments. Our representatives have visited Kingston, Smiths Falls, Brockville, Kemptville, North Gower, Oxford Mills, Cumberland, Nepean, Carleton Place, Russell, Kars, Upper Canada Village and Ogdensburg, N.Y. in the line of duty. At home here in Osgoode Township we took part in Canada Day at Osgoode, the opening of the addition to the Town Hall in Metcalfe, Metcalfe Fair and the Carleton County Plowing Match.

We were at home to visitors on Heritage Day, Pioneer Day and for our Strawberry Festival.

Visitors to the museum were from Europe and the British Isles and in North America from Yukon to Texas and many points between. Our museum was open to visitors from mid May to the end of December, 6 days a week and sometimes 7. Visitors included the Exec. Dir. of the Ontario Historical Society and a rep of the Ontario Ministry of Culture and Communications, Guides and Brownies and 4H groups. We also hosted Women's Institute meetings, and introduced local history to students at Castor Valley school and at Metcalfe Public school.

Improvements to our museums included the landscaping of the agricultural building, a proper sign over the front doors and the installation of a farm windmill in front of the building. Inside, some shelving was installed and much work was done repairing and re-conditioning artifacts. In the original museum, plumbing was

PETITION FOR LAND GRANT

To His Excellency Sir Peregrine Maitland, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Upper Canada and Major General Commanding His Majesty's Forces therein etc., ...In Council.

The Petition of Catharine McDonell of Cornwall in the Eastern District and Province of Upper Canada aforesaid...

Humbly sheweth that your Petitioner is the Daughter of the late Alexander McDonell of lot number thirty in the third Concession of the Township of Cornwall, a loyalist U.E., who died at Cornwall aforesaid in the year of our Lord 1799, and wife of Archibald McDonell, late Assistant Adjutant General of the Militia in Upper Canada. Your Petitioner has never received any land or order for land from the Crown, Wherefore your Petitioner prays your Excellency in Council will be pleased to grant her two hundred acres of the Waste lands of the Crown and permit Archibald McDonell of Cornwall be her Attorney, to locate the same and receive the Patent when completed and your Petitioner will ever pray ...

Cornwall, 12th October 1820. Catharine McDonell

Eastern District: Before me Joseph Anderson, Esquire, Chairman for the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, assembled in and for said District, personally appeared Catharine McDonell the within mentioned Petitioner and made oath that she is the person she therein describes herself to be, that she is lawfully married to Archibald McDonell aforesaid and has never received any land or order for land from the Crown.

Sworn before me in the Open Sessions this 12th Day of October 1820.

Eastern District: We Joseph Anderson, Esquire, Chairman, and Archibald McLean, Esquire, Clerk of the Peace, certify that the within named Petitioner Catherine McDonellis the Daughter of the late Alexander McDonell of lot No. 30 in the third Concession of the Township of Cornwall, who died at Cornwall aforesaid in 1799, and that her Husband Archibald McDonell did his duty in defence of the Province during the late War.

Dated at the Court house in Open Sessions this 12th Day of October 1820.

Alexander McDonell the King's Son drew 1/2 Lot no. 30 in the 3rd Concession, Cornwall, but resided on W 1/2 Lot no. 10, South side Middle Branch Riviere aux Raisins, Cornwall, which was drawn by John McDonell, his Father, a very aged Man.

The Petition of Catharine McDonell for land as D.U.E.; Received 2nd February 1821 from her Husband.

Signed John Beikie, Council Clerk.
Read 7th February 1821. Granted. Order issued 10 February 1821.

LOST AND FOUND

Some of our members living in the
Metcalfe area will remember that,
while the McGirr family lived on the
west side of the 8th line road (lot
27, con.7) they also owned 100 acres
across the road at lot 27, con. 8.
What is not commonly known is that
Wm. McGirr and his family were
living on the east side as early as
1831. They quite obviously lived in
a shanty on the ridge which is about
80 rods back from the road. That is
also the side of the legendary house
which was built for a bride about
1884 and which no one ever occupied
when the wedding failed to happen.

About 1975, I found a copper coin
in the soil near the old house. It
is dated 1837 and is in what might
be termed very good condition. About
the same thickness of our one dollar
coin and just slightly larger in
diameter. One side has the words
BANK TOKEN HALF PENNY 1837 around
the rim. In the centre, St Andrew's
Cross surrounded by a garter
inscribed with the words *CONCORDIA
SALUS*. In the interstices of the
cross are a thistle, a rose, three
shamrocks and a beaver. A ribbon at
the bottom of the garter is stamped
with the words *CITY BANK*.

On the other side, around the rim,
are the words *PROVINCE DU BAS CANADA
UN SOU*, and in the centre the figure
of a habitant wearing a toque, and a
knee length coat belted with a sash.
The figure seems to be carrying a
whip or goad in his right hand.

The most interesting aspect is
that the coin shows almost no sign
of wear and probably indicated that
it was lost while it was fairly new.
Money was very scarce in those early
days and no doubt handled very
carefully. Perhaps the probability
of it being lost are almost as great
as the probability of it being found
some 150 years later.

THE McCABE LIST

Early Irish in the Ottawa Valley
Bruce Elliott

Published with the permission of
Her Majesty's Stationery Office is
without a doubt the most important
genealogical document in the Ottawa
Valley to surface in recent years.
It provides the signature or mark,
county, parish and townland of
origin, number of male and female
children and names and addresses of
relatives in the home land for some
700 mostly Irish families who were
in the vicinity of Bytown on 5th of
February 1829. A richer genealogical
gold mine on early Irish immigrants
can scarcely be imagined.

The list was discovered by John
McCabe, the well-known Belfast
genealogist who delivered the
Houston Memorial Lecture at Seminar
88, while researching at the Public
Record Office in England. Suspecting
its value to many of those attend
the seminar, he brought photocopies
of the first few dozen pages with
him. He readily agreed to its
publication in "Families", if the
British government granted
permission reproduce it. Bruce
Elliott obtained a complete
photocopy and transcribed it. The
list should help resolve countless
long standing research deadlocks for
those with Irish ancestry in eastern
Ontario and western Quebec. Hundreds
of familiar valley names appear.

Owing to the disturbance of usual conditions caused by the war and the general hard times prevalent at present, we beg to announce that our prices from Feb. 18, 1915 will be as follows - Hair cutting - 15 cents, shave 10 cents, shampoo - 15 cents, head rub 10 cents, razor honing - 25 cents, massage 20 cents, hair singe - 10 cents, neck shave 5 cents, beard trimming - 10 cents. Signed Chas. Beaucaire, Geo. C. Tuck.

March 11 - Mr. Storey, tea merchant, passed through Vernon on Friday last.

March 18 - Mr. Geo. Clark of Metcalfe has sold his farm to Mr. James Mullins and purposes moving to Brantford where he has purchased a farm.

June 24 - Mr. and Mrs. C.A. Carson of Metcalfe celebrated the 20th Anniversary of their wedding on June 19th and entertained several of their friends in honour of the day. The guests were Mr. and Mrs. T.H. Craig, Mr. and Mrs. Stinson Pratt, Mr. and Mrs. David Stinson of North Gower, Mr. and Mrs. C.A. Armstrong and daughter Muriel, Mr. and Mrs. H.E. Carson of Kemptville, Mrs. R.L. Kerr of Mountain.

The old dispute as to the boundary line between the townships of Mountain in Dundas and Ottawa in Carleton came up in county court on Saturday. For upwards of 40 years the dispute has been carried on. There is a "jag" in the road past James Clark's farm and the farmers in the township of Mountain have been fighting to have the bend taken out.

May 11, 1916 - Five new Chevrolet cars were delivered to Manotick on Friday last, the purchasers being Mr. A.D. Babcock, Mr. Johnston Clapp, Mr. Sam Walters, Mr. Leo Driscoll and Dr. O'Hara.

We are sorry to report that Dr. Crawford is leaving Vernon.

Mrs. Lorne Campbell had a quilting here last week and a euchre party following in the evening.

June 15 - Mrs. William Boyd and Mrs. William Saunders of Osgoode left on Tuesday for Winnipeg where they will spend some time with the latter's sister Mrs. Dunbar.

Oct. 5 - Mr. Allan Carson of Chicago was the guest of his brother Mr. Charles Carson of Metcalfe last week and renewed many old acquaintances in town.

The steamer Rideau Queen which for a number of years has been plying between Kingston and Smiths Falls was sold by public auction on Saturday afternoon. Mr. Murdick of Trenton, agent for the Trent Valley Navigation Company purchased the boat for \$5,450. After the boat has been thoroughly overhauled, she will be used by her new owner in local trading on the Trent Valley route.

Dec. 7 - Mr. Ellis Otto of Osgoode Station who has been a civil servant in Ottawa for the past year was transferred to Regina on November 30th.

Jan. 25, 1917 - During Mr. J.E. McRostie's absence from Kemptville to attend the short courses at Merrickville, Mrs. McRostie will be at the home of her parents Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Stanley near Metcalfe.

The well-known Kimberly Hotel situated in the village of Kars on the bank of the Rideau river, 20 miles from Ottawa, is for sale. This is an 18 room house with a large grocery store in connection; stabling sheds in good state of repair. There is a good tourist and commercial trade. Reason for selling - lack of help. Owner S.H. O'Callaghan.

March 8 - Line-up of the Metcalfe Hockey Team. Goal - R. Spears, Point - W. Latimer, C. Point - Art Siguaw, Centre - L. Nadeau, Left Wing - H. Latimer, Rover - L. Dowser, Spares - L. Siguaw, F. Dowser, V. Craig (who is now playing on the Ottawa team.)

April 5 - Mr. Gus McEvoy met with an accident last week which cost him the loss of a couple of fingers. While working around the sawing machines belonging to Mr. J.R. Blanchfield his hand was brought in contact with the saw and was cut severely.
